RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Competitors must enter their Stock, Produce etc, with the Secretary under every Section and Class in which they intend competing. The Entry Form must be delivered to the Secretary, duly filled up, no later than 1ST July 2009. Exhibitors entering Pedigree Cattle and Horses must send in Stud Book or Herd Book number, together with those for the Sire and Dam and also Sire of Dam.

2. All Stock for competition must be in the showground at least one hour before any Classes entered are due to commence on Friday 31st July and before 8.00am on Saturday 1st August 2009. No stock to be removed from the Showground before 3.30pm unless by permission of the Directors through the Secretary. Further all Horses, including Riding and Driving, besides being exhibited in the Show ring when judged, must present when called upon, and Jumping horses must again perform over the fences if requested by the Directors, and this under a penalty of £10.00. Prize gainers will forfeit their Prizes awarded unless they comply with this regulation.

3. Stock must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor and in his actual possession for at least two calendar months previous to the Show (unless where a longer period is specified). Exhibitors are bound, when required to satisfy the Directors that their exhibits comply with the regulations and conditions of competition, otherwise such exhibits may be disqualified, and any Prizes awarded then forfeited. All Horses and pure bred Cattle including calves (but excluding only commercial cattle), must be halter led.

4. Breed Society Rules will apply where Perthshire Agricultural Society is affiliated to a Breed Society.

5. No animal to be shown in more than one section at this Show on Saturday 1st August 2009. No substitutes to be shown.

6. Two year old Heifers of the Beef Shorthorn and Aberdeen Angus Breeds must be in milk or in calf when exhibited, and Prizes will if necessary be withheld till birth is certified, which must be within nine months after the show.

7. No Stock to be shown before the Judges with Prize ticket still attached. Where an Animal in any

class has been awarded the Championship of the Breed, the Animal second to it in its Class must be brought before the Judge before placing the Reserve Champion, but in the first instance only First Prize Animals will be brought before the Judge.

8. The Directors reserve the right to themselves to substitute plate to the like or greater value where specifically given, instead of money Prizes offered: and in any Class where there is no competition the Prize money can be withheld unless the Judges consider the Animal or Animals of sufficient merit.

9. Stockhandlers must remain in close attendance on their Stock in the Showground and if any lot or lots of Stock are without attendance during the time of Judging, they are liable to be passed over by the Judges and disqualified; and if any parties in attendance upon Animals are not in readiness to Parade when called upon, the owners of the Animals are liable to forfeit all honours conferred upon them during the day. Attendants, when showing Animals in the Judging ring and on Parade, must wear number tickets.

10. Driving competitions will be at any time during the day, when called upon by the Directors. Any competitors failing to comply with this regulation are liable to a penalty of £10.00 and if Prize takers, will forfeit the Prizes awarded.

11. All Horses must be halter led, and owners of Stock are particularly requested to see that their stock attendants in charge of Stock remain beside the Animals within the Showground

12. All persons in charge of Stock or other exhibits, and all persons admitted to the Showground shall be subject to the Rules of the Society, and must obey the orders of the Directors, Secretary and other Officials of the Society.

13. No Animal shall be taken out of its pen or stall, after the Judging has commenced, except by orders of the Directors, or with the Permission of the Secretary. Stock will not be allowed to stand about the Showground in groups. Those infringing this rule will be liable to a fine of £10.00, or may be expelled from the Showground

14. The Directors and Officials have the power to enforce the Regulations of the Society in their different departments and Exhibitors shall be answerable for the conduct of their stockhandlers or representatives.

15. The Directors reserve the right of refusing any entries they may think fit; to exclude or cancel any entry made; or to prohibit the exhibition of any of the Stock; also to cancel any Class or Section; or to with-hold any of the Prizes if there is not sufficient competitors; or to rearrange classes; or to make enquiry into any breach of the Rules and Regulations with or without any protest from any Exhibitor. . The Directors reserve the rights to cancel, limit, or amend the space provided for any stance for implements or Trade Stands at any time.

16. All protests to be lodged with the Secretary by 4.00pm on Friday 31st July or 2.00pm on Saturday 1st August 2009 along with £25.00 (which will be forfeited if the objection is over-ruled). The decision of the Directors on all cases of dispute shall be final.

17. Free badges with admission tickets to the Showground (for Members) will be given on payment of annual subscription to the Secretary. No Member whose subscription is outstanding shall be entitled to this badge and admission ticket.

18. Holders of Long Service Medals of the Highland and Agricultural Society will be admitted free on production of their Medals.

19. Trade Exhibitors will receive one admission ticket for each 2 metre of frontage. (Maximum amount of tickets = 10).

20. The Society, its Officers or employees shall not be responsible to any person whatsoever while upon the Society's premises or while entering or leaving the same, for any damage or loss however caused to the property of any such person or for any injury, fatal or otherwise to any such person.

21. The Society, its Officers or employees, shall not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss however caused that may occur to any Exhibitor or his employee, or to any Animal, article or property brought into the Showground or while entering or leaving or being carried into or out of the said Showground. Each Exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any Animal, article or property exhibited or brought to the Showground, by him and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned.

HEALTH & SAFETY

SAFETY POLICY

Standards and Rules form part of the Exhibitor Entry Form and a condition of the Entry will be an acceptance of these rules and regulations.

1. A Safety Officer will be appointed to ensure the safety of the event and the implementation of the Safety Policy.
2. Extra Stewards are appointed to ensure all safety precautions are complied with and the Chief Steward in each section will be in charge of their own section.
3. Animals being moved through the event area will be separated from the public by barrier walkways and the movement of animals to judging rings will be organised to create as little stress as possible.
4. Bulls should be secured by rings or screws
5. Animals, which are excited or aggressive, should not be paraded and may require to be withdrawn from the event.
6. Children should not be allowed to handle bulls or fractious animals. In the Juvenile classes an adult should always be in attendance to take over if a child is having difficulty in controlling an animal.
7. All riders in the pony section must wear hats conforming to British Standards and chinstraps should be used.
8. Dogs should be kept on leads at all times.
9. An adult who is fully trained in its safe use should only operate any plant, machinery or equipment used prior to, of or after the Show. Children under the age of 13 must not be allowed to ride on or operate machinery including all Terrain Vehicles.
10. Pedestrian Access Routes from Car Parks will be clearly signposted.
11. Exhibitors, trade stands, caterers, retailers etc using LPG Gas must comply with HSE regulations in respect of storage and use of any containers that they may bring.

12. First Aid Facilities will be provided on the day of the show and these will be clearly signposted and identified.
13. Emergency Services will have access to all parts of the showground at all times.
14. In the event of a major incident an incident sheet will be available from the Secretary's office on which proper information will be recorded immediately.

CODE OF PRACTICE FOR HEALTH AND SAFETY TRADE STANDS

1. Any plant, machinery or equipment used prior to, during or after the show should only be operated by an adult who is fully trained in its safe use. Children under the age of 13 must not be allowed to ride on or operate machinery including All Terrain vehicles.
2. Exhibitors, trade stands, caterers, retailers etc. using LPG Gas must comply with HSE regulations in respect of storage and use of any containers that they may bring.
3. All electrical generators must be adequately guarded. Only **diesel generators** allowed on the show field
4. All stalls should be properly erected, securely tied-in and as far as possible avoid protruding stays and jagged edges to trestles etc.
5. Steps and stairs into sideshows and caravans should be firmly positioned and of proper construction. Where applicable handrails should be provided.
6. Dangerous machinery should be positioned, guarded or otherwise protected that it is not accessible to children or other persons.
7. It is essential that all persons engaging in the preparation and cooking of food are aware of the need for certain elementary precautions of safety in order to minimise the risk of accidents.
8. First Aid facilities will be provided on the day of the show and these will be clearly signposted and identified.
9. Emergency Services will have access to all parts of the showground at all times.
10. In the event of a major incident and incident sheet will be available from the Secretary's Office on which proper information will be recorded immediately.
11. A Safety Officer has been appointed to check on safety procedures at the show and it is hoped they will have the full co-operation of all Exhibitors and Trade Stand Holders.

THE CATTLE PASSPORTS ORDER 1996

There has been a change of Regulations that the above order has imposed on the owners of bovine animals born after 1st July 1996, with particular regard to the showing of these animals at agricultural shows.

The Order states:

Article 4

When cattle are taken to a show, fair or similar function and it is intended to return the animal to the same holding, the keeper:

- a. before moving the animal off the holding, shall complete the next empty box marked "seller's details" in Part 11 of the cattle passport as if the movement were for the purposes of sale;
- b. on arrival at the show, shall mark the box headed "Details of Market" with the name and address of the show; and
- c. on returning to the original holding, complete the box marked "Buyer's Details" in Part 11 of the cattle passport, as if he were the buyer, within 36 hours of arrival or before the animal is moved off that

holding, if sooner.

- d. **Important changes to legislation** came into effect on 6th April 2007. From that date keepers cannot use the application for a cattle passport form (CPP12) to move calves from their holdings. Calves that attend shows after this date must have a chequebook-style passport (CPP13)

Sheep & Goat Identification and Traceability Requirements

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to complete all documentation as per the regulations

- **The Show CPH is 89/705/8000.**

SHEEP AND GOAT MOVEMENT DOCUMENTS AT SHOWS

Keepers

Keepers sending stock to shows will now need to complete two movement documents, one for the journey to the show and one for the return journey, regardless of the length of time spent at the show. This has been brought in to remove confusion where the show may run to more than one day or where animals are sold at the show or return to a different holding.

The movement documents to and from the show must be completed by the keeper of the animals – the same way as movement documents would be completed for stock moving to seasonal grazing locations. The white copy of each form should be sent to SAMU with the pink and yellow copies retained by the keeper.

The requirement to record the individual tags of the animals moving to the show has been removed. The movement document simply needs the number of animals being moved and arriving.

Show Secretaries

The completion of the movement document is entirely the responsibility of the keeper showing the stock and it is their responsibility to return the forms to SAMU. The form will require the CPH number of the show to be completed correctly and all livestock entrants should be made aware of the CPH number in advance of the show.

Summary

- Keepers sending sheep to shows will be required to fill in, and return, a sheep and goat movement document for the journey to the show and one for the return journey, regardless of the duration of the show.
- Individual tag numbers are not required on the movement document.
- The keeper showing the animals is responsible for the completion and return of the movement document to SAMU.
- The new document only has room for the destination holding number and not the address. The name and/or address are not acceptable it must be the holding number that is filled in here. Show secretaries should make entrants aware of the CPH number for the show.

New sheep and goat movement documents were issued to sheep and goat keepers during May 2008. Supplies of unused old style movement pads should now be disposed of, taking care to retain copies of previously completed movement documents.

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A CURRENT CAE NEGATIVE CERTIFICATE DATED WITHIN THE PREVIOUS 12 MONTHS OF THE SHOW OR HAVE BGS MONITORED HERD STATUS [SEPARATE PENNING WILL NOT BE PROVIDED]. IN THE CASE OF KIDS ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THEIR DAMS CAE CERTIFICATE VALID FOR THE DATE OF THE SHOW. NO GOAT SHOULD BE BROUGHT TO THE SHOWGROUND THAT HAS EVER SHOWN A REACTION TO THE CAE TEST.

GUIDE FOR SHEEP & GOAT SHOW EXHIBITORS

Sheep & Goat Identification and Traceability Requirements

- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure all documentation is completed as per the regulations advised by SAMU
- **The Show CPH is 89/705/8000.**

SHEEP AND GOAT MOVEMENT DOCUMENTS AT SHOWS

Keepers

Keepers sending stock to shows will now need to complete two movement documents, one for the journey to the show and one for the return journey, regardless of the length of time spent at the show. This has been bought in to remove confusion where the show may run to more than one day or where animals are sold at the show or return to a different holding.

The movement documents to and from the show must be completed by the keeper of the animals – the same way as movement documents would be completed for stock moving to seasonal grazing locations. The white copy of each form should be sent to SAMU with the pink and yellow copies retained by the keeper.

The requirement to record the individual tags of the animals moving to the show has been removed. The movement document simply needs the number of animals being moved and arriving.

Show Secretaries

The completion of the movement document is entirely the responsibility of the keeper showing the stock and it is their responsibility to return the forms to SAMU. The form will require the CPH number of the show to be completed correctly and all livestock entrants should be made aware of the CPH number in advance of the show.

Summary

- Keepers sending sheep to shows will be required to fill in, and return, a sheep and goat movement document for the journey to the show and one for the return journey, regardless of the duration of the show.
- Individual tag numbers are not required on the movement document.
- The keeper showing the animals is responsible for the completion and return of the movement document to SAMU.
- The new document only has room for the destination holding number and not the address. The name and/or address are not acceptable it must be the holding number that is filled in here. Show secretaries should make entrants aware of the CPH number for the show.

New sheep and goat movement documents were issued to sheep and goat keepers during May 2008. Supplies of unused old style movement pads should now be disposed of, taking care to retain copies of previously completed movement documents.

• **MAEDI VISNA:** Exhibitors should note we only accept Sheep from Fully Accredited Flocks in the Maedi Visna Flock Scheme in Border Leicester, Suffolk, Any Other Breed Classes, Charollais and Texel Classes. Entries in Sections for Blackface, Cheviot and Jacob will only be accepted from non-designated flocks. Blue Faced Leicester, Cross Sheep and JAC Butchers' Lambs will be accepted from either status.

All Accredited Sheep must be accompanied by the Official Maedi Visna Status certificate for collection [**photo copies will not be accepted**] by the Chief Steward at the Entry Gate of the Showground. Exhibitors of Accredited Sheep should be aware of the Ministry of Agriculture's Transport Regulations. Sheep are shown entirely at their owner's risk.

All females of all breeds except Dorset Horn, Polled Dorset and Finnish Landrace to be entered and/or exhibited are:-

- a. Non Pregnant (EMPTY)
- b. Have not lambed within 30 days prior to entry to the Show.
- c. Not subject to procedures which changed the seasonal breeding pattern.

All Shows and Sales outwith 1st May to 31st August must comprise only animals from flocks/herds in either Category 1V of the Sheep and Goat Health Scheme or the Scrapie Export Register or be segregated in an approved manner.
